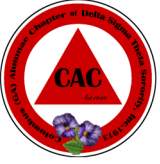

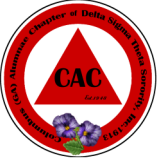

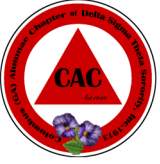


The 2nd Annual Social Action Luncheon presented
