

Three CAC members, Crystal Waye, Christie Black-Murrell, and Anntoinette Briley embraced us with their original poems about sisterhood as well as their reflections on the meaning of a sister. The Fountain City Slam Youth, Cynthnia, Macy, and Trinity, added highlights to the reflection and retraced the footsteps of our 22 Founders during the Woman Suffrage Event on March 3, 1913. Mace Dent-Johnson, a Harvard University Graduate was another featured guest and she expanded on the legacy and some of the masterpieces of various influential poets. Like mother like daughter, her mom, Lowanda Dent-Johnson portrayed her poetic side as she recited a famous and well known poem titled, " A Room Full of Sister" by Mona Lake Jones. This was the first Virtual Live Poetry Slam Event hosted by the Arts & Letters Committee. It was impactful, uplifting, reflecting, and appealing as it attracted 730 views just within 1 week of airing on Facebook.





At our second January meeting the committee hosted a college application seminar. Members wanted to expose the GEMS to the many Historically Black Colleges.


