IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONVENTION FOR PARTICIPANTS

Convention Attire Update

Public Meeting Business casual (please wear comfortable shoes).

Plenary I: Formal Opening

White attire only (includes wraps/shawls) - no pants.

Social Action Luncheon White attire with a touch of red.

Memorial Observance

Red, white or black attire, no pants (must be a single color). Violet corsage can be worn.

Plenary Sessions

Business attire (suits, dresses, skirts/blouses, dressy pant suits).

Plenary Session: Formal Closing

Business attire or after-five attire, if attending the Grand Sisterhood Soiree.

Ecumenical Service

Business casual or travel attire.

*NOTE: Since the Ecumenical Service is the last event of the convention and a travel day, we are changing the attire guideline so sorors and guests may feel comfortable wearing travel or business casual attire - no jeans.



54TH NATIONAL CONVENTION

IMPORTANT CONVENTION INFORMATION FOR PARTICIPANTS

Just a few friendly reminders on appropriate dress.

The Protocol and Traditions Team looks forward to seeing you in New Orleans in during the 54th National Convention. To help you prepare, we are providing you with a few reminders of some of the topics we provided in our monthly communication during the 2018 – 2019 Sororal year.

Attire guidelines are listed on pages 19-21 in the 2011 Protocol and Traditions Manual. Delta business attire is traditionally a business suit, dress or other clothing that reflects a professional style. Pants must be full length. All forms of Capris, leggings, cropped pants or gauchos are not allowed. Jackets, t-shirts or sweaters classified as paraphernalia are not allowed. A blazer with a Delta Crest is allowed as is a sweater with small symbols. Flip flops, foam bottom shoes or beach shoes are not allowed. Denim or Khaki attire and baseball caps are not allowed.

The information noted above from the Protocol and Traditions Manual has also been shared at National Conventions, Regional Conferences and State Clusters. Additional information shared in Protocol and Traditions Workshops held at these events includes: Any attire outside of business attire i.e. leggings, and jackets that would not be considered business attire is prohibited (per the guidelines as identified in the Protocol and Traditions Manual, which can be downloaded from the National Website).

All of the items mentioned above are topics frequently covered in workshops held at National Conventions and Regional Conferences. Questions are welcomed during the Protocol and Traditions Workshops which are usually held during these events.
